



- 7. Stewards will affix the Prize cards with the names of the successful exhibitors belonging to the number in the Award Book written thereon to exhibits and where ribbons are awarded, shall fix same to successful exhibit. Prize money vouchers to be delivered to the Secretary.
- Special attention of the Stewards, Judges and exhibitors is drawn to the Association rule which sets out that all Stewards withdraw while judging of exhibits, in which they are interested, directly or indirectly, is taking place.

#### NOTICE TO JUDGES

- Judges shall attend at the Secretary's office on the Showground at 10am on the first day of the Show and report themselves to the Secretary and to each other and to the Stewards.
- 10. The Judges shall be appointed by the Committee and their duties shall be to award prizes to the various classes which have been assigned for their judgement.










More importantly in determining the overall Champion Farmer, the changes aim to take into account <u>overall management in</u> dealing with their specific enterprises, soils, and environment, rather than relying heavily on estimated yield to determine a winner.

#### **FIELD CROP COMPETITION**

The field crop competitions will comprise the following sections:

- 1. Field Wheat Section (run under existing ASC rules see below), with the district winner eligible to compete in the ASC Western NSW zone judging
- 2. Cereal Section all winter cereal varieties excluding bread wheat

#### RULES AND GUIDELINES FOR THE FIELD CROP COMPETITION

Entrants can choose to enter in two out of the four sections listed above in order to compete in the field crop competition. For example, one wheat entry and one canola entry OR one barley entry and one pasture entry.

- · Only one entry is allowed per section i.e. an entrant cannot enter twice in the cereal section.
- · Minimum area for judging is 20 hectares in one field.
- Entrants must be current members of the Peak Hill P A & H Association
- Eligible area the field must be within a 40km radius from Peak Hill
- Entrants are to provide samples of the crops entered to support the 2024 Agricultural Produce section of the show
- The entrant or a representative should be available to provide details of the entry at the time of judging as arranged with the chief steward

#### **ASC GUIDELINES**

- 1. Only one entry will be accepted from each individual farmer or share farmer in a local competition.
- 2. A competitor shall not be eligible to enter in two different competitions with a crop or crops from one farm.
- 3. Each competitor shall enter an area of 20 hectares of wheat of one variety.
- 4. The crop must have been sown in one piece of the farm crop area.
- 5. Competition area is to be defined by a hay cut right around or to be clearly defined by flag pegs. There is to be at least one headland and as far as possible the area to be rectangular and running parallel to a fence line or a natural topographical line of demarcation, eg creek. Areas which are pegged irregularly across a paddock, obviously to avoid poor or eroded patches, are not eligible.
- 6. A crop grown on artificially watered ground shall not be eligible for entry.
- 7. Only NSW DPI Silo Group north varieties are eligible to compete.
- 8. Every competitor shall enter at least 6 kilograms of Wheat for competition at the 2024 Peak Hill Show.

#### ASC DRYLAND FIELD WHEAT COMPETITION CONT

The winning entry is eligible to compete in the ASC Championship Field Wheat Competition.



#### ENTER THE COOKING SECTION AT THE PEAK HILL SHOW

The Peak Hill Show is only a few weeks away so start thinking about what you could enter to ensure our Show Pavilion is full of wonderful exhibits.

There are two classes for cooking, Class L is open to all & Class LB is for girls & boys under 18 years.

Do read the schedule CAREFULLY! All exhibits are to be on paper plates with your name clearly written underneath so we can return your cooking at the end of the Show.

When you receive your entry tickets, please staple or stick them to the top of the plate where they can be clearly visible.

Lastly put your entry into a clear plastic oven bag.

#### A FEW TIPS

#### **ICING**

- · Check if cake is iced or not.
- Check the colour. For example, Carrot cake requires white icing.
- Cakes should be neatly iced with icing coming to the edge of the cake, not running down the sides.

#### **CAKES**

- · Judges look at the appearance of the cake.
- When cooling your cakes, cover cooling racks with several tea towels so there are no rack marks on cake.
- Carefully grease or line cake tins so cake comes out with clean smooth sides.
- Aroma & taste, Judges taste & smell exhibit. For example orange cakes. Aroma is an indication of care taken in baking & the freshness & correct balance of ingredients.
- · Texture. No big holes.

Cooking should be done prior to the first day of the Show.

Check details in the schedule regarding your entry eg cake tin shape, iced or uniced, number of biscuits/scones etc, colour of icing. Entries will be disqualified if they do not adhere to these guidelines.

If your attempts are not perfect do not be put off. Still enter, as others may have had similar problems. Obviously if it is a disaster, it is better eaten at home whilst still fresh!!

#### HINTS

A few tips to remember when entering in the Jams & Preserves section

- First, read the show schedule, especially conditions at the beginning of each section.
- · All jars are 375 grams unless otherwise stated.
- Clean, sterilized jars with clean lids are a must. No advertising on top of lid cover with paper if there is.
   Fill right to the top of the shoulder/bottom of the neck
- Fill right to the top of the shoulder/bottom of the necl of the jar and seal while hot.
- Jars must not show signs of mould likely a result of under cooking, over ripe fruit, or faulty sealing.
- Jams are made from fresh or frozen fruit.
- Chutneys are made with fruit and vegetables, spicy and sometimes hot.

- Marmalades are made from citrus fruit, can be a single variety or combination. Show marmalade is a fine coloured jelly with very fine shreds of peel.
- Pickles are made in a mustard sauce or in a clear liquid. Vegetables can be raw or cooked but firm.
- Relishes can be sweet, tangy or spiced. Fruit or veges are cut more finely and cooked for less time.
- Sauces must be able to be poured.
- · All jars must be labelled.
- Lemon butter should be smooth and creamy without lumps. It should have a fresh lemon flavour. The colour should be that of a ripe lemon.





#### **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- 1. The name, residence and district of exhibitor and as full particulars as possible, must be given to the Secretary with entry one week prior to the Show. No late entries will be received after 12 noon on Saturday preceding the Show. If any doubt arises as to the declaration of the Exhibitor, they shall not be entitled to any prize which may be awarded to them until the Committee shall have satisfactory proof that the declaration is correct and any member making a false declaration shall be subject to all or any of the following penalties: Forfeiture of prize, non permission to exhibit again, expulsion from the Association.
- 2. All Exhibitors of horses, cattle, sheep and dogs must be bona-fide owners or representatives of owners of same at time of entry. Exhibits of farm produce, fruit, vegetables, flowers, cookery, needlework, photography and fine arts must be the work of, or grown by the Exhibitor.
- 3. A ticket will be delivered by the Secretary, at the time of entry, to the person in charge of each exhibit, for its being received in the Show, yard or pavilion and no exhibits whatever shall be allowed to enter without such ticket, but such ticket DOES NOT admit the bearer free of charge.
- 4. Any exhibitor shall be allowed to exhibit more than one lot in each Section, but he shall not be competent to enter a lot in one Section and afterwards remove it for competition in another Section, except otherwise stated.
- The competing exhibits shall be Classes and distinguished by Ticket or Numbers, to be fixed to each lot immediately they are placed in the Showground, Yard or Pavilion.
- 6. The Committee shall appoint competent persons to act as Judges, who in forming their opinions, will particularly attend to the instructions to be delivered for their guidance. Their decision shall be final. If the Judges consider that any exhibit in any particular Class or Section is not worthy of a prize, no award will be made.
- All Trophies awarded on point score basis as follows: 3
  points for First, 1 point for Second, except otherwise
  specified.
- The Committee shall nominate one or more members of the Association as Stewards in each Class to accompany the Judges to prevent interference during the examination of exhibits.
- 9. The awards will be given and ticket fixed to all winners in their respective Sections by 12 noon on the first day of the Show, as far as possible. Any exhibitor interfering in any way with the Judges or calling into question their awards on the ground, may be removed from the Showground and in future, disqualified from exhibiting at the Peak Hill P A & H Association Incorporated Show.
- 10. All Pavilion Exhibits must be delivered before 9am on the first day of the Show or as otherwise specified. School work to be delivered Monday prior to the Show. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 11. No sheep shall be allowed to be exhibited with more than12 months growth of wool, unless specified at the time of

- entrance. Date of shearing must be given with each entry and entered in the Steward's Book.
- 12. If the Judges are of the opinion that any exhibit is unfairly exhibited, they shall have the power to disqualify such exhibit and award prizes as the may see fit.
- 13. The Showground will be open for admission from 8am on the first day of the Show. No exhibit will be removed before 5pm on the first day and second day of the Show without the sanction of the Stewards of the department and any exhibits removed the first day must be returned to their respective positions by 9am on the second day of the Show, failing which all prizes awarded to the be forfeited and their owners may be debarred from entering exhibits at a future Show. SPECIAL Pavilion will be open to Exhibitors from 5.00pm to 5.30pm on the second day of the Show to receive from the Stewards their exhibits, but on no account will any exhibit be delivered after the hour of 6pm on that day.
- 14. Should any questions arise as to the weight or quality of any exhibit, the same shall be decided by the Judges of such exhibit and any exhibit being less weight or quantity than stated in the Schedule shall not receive a prize.
- 15. The Association will take care of Exhibits sent to its Show, but will not accept any responsibility for damage done to them either by fire, theft or any other cause whatever and will only receive entrance from exhibitors, subject to these Rules being accepted by the exhibitors.
- 16. No Ribbons will be allowed to be worn on the Showground, except by prize winners of the present Peak Hill Show. Any person infringing this Rule will be liable to disqualification and exhibit removed from the Ground.
- 17. The Committee reserves the right to call upon any competitor subject to age limit, at any time to furnish, at his or her expense, birth certificate or other proof of age and may at its discretion withhold any prize money until such certificate of proof shall have been furnished.
- 18. A fee of \$30 must accompany any protest which will be forfeited if considered frivolous. Protests must be lodged with the Secretary in writing not later than 3pm on the day of award.
- 19. A local competitor is defined as a person living within a 40km radius of Peak Hill.
- 20. No vehicles are to be driven about the Showground. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 21. The water tanks are not to be removed from the Showground, except in the case of any emergency.
- 22. No Electric Fences are allowed on the Showground.
- 23. The Committee has the right to refuse entry to or remove any person from the showground as deemed necessary.
- 24. Abusiveness and cruelty to animals will not be tolerated.
- 25. No alcohol or glass bottles are to be brought into the showground during licenced functions.


